Reading - what can you do at home?

General Expectations

- 20 minutes per day
- Make space
- Listen to your child
- Allow self-correction
- Continue to read higher-level books aloud
- Discuss vocabulary and content



Reading levels & Literacy Packs

CE1 have levelled reading books & CP will before Toussaint.


- Levels given based on phonic knowledge
- Reading records increase home-school communication and efficacy

Designed for students:

- To build confidence
- Practise application of phonic strategies
- Apply current phase of phonics taught in class
- Increase vocabulary with wide range of subjects
- Demonstrate comprehension through intonation and expression

Writing

Speaking and listening

- An integral part of each lesson
- Debates
- Whole class discussions
- Group and pair work
- Presentations
- Drama activities
- Listening to others; taking into account other opinions; presenting their ideas clearly
- Spoken language underpins the development of reading and writing





Homework

- ★ CP: Spelling and reading (later!)
- ★ CE1: Spelling.
- ★ CE2: Spelling, Seesaw (weekly tasks based on library book).
- ★ CM1: Spelling, Seesaw (small tasks or presentation projects at various points during the year).
- ★ CM2: Spelling, guided reading tasks on Google Classroom.
- **★** And reading!








Learning Development

Learning Development


- Needs-based approach
