
At the end of 3ème you will sit the **Diplome National du Brevet** (French written and oral exam).

Anglophone Section students will sit extra ORAL exams in L&L and H/G: the **DNB Option Internationale.**








Classroom Rules

- If a student is late to a class during the day, you will not be allowed to join the lesson unless you have a written note to explain (from the teacher of the previous sequence, for example).








Homework Assignments & Communications




Anglophone Section Library

The Anglophone Section Library

'Library Rules' posters to explain:

- How and when you can use the library.
- Behaviour in the library.
- Borrowing books, and what happens if your book is overdue / lost / damaged.



Anglophone Section Secondary Library

When is the Library open?

- Check the library timetable to see the opening hours.
- The timetable is on the library door, the Anglophone classrooms and on Google Classroom.

I'm in collège - can I come to the library during permanence?

- Yes you can! You'll need to collect a slip from the vie scolaire first, then show it to the librarian.
- All students need to sign in when the come to the library.

What can I do in the library?

- You can... browse the books, read, study...quietly!
- Eating is not permitted.
- You cannot use your phone in the library.

How can I borrow books?

- Once you've chosen a book, take it to the librarian in charge and they will check it out for you.
- You can borrow a maximum of 2 books at a time, for up to 2 weeks.
- If you want to renew your loan, bring the book back to the library and ask the librarian to check it out for you again.
- If someone else has asked to borrow the book, you won't be able to renew it.

How do I return a library book? Library books can be dropped in one of the return boxes in:

- The Library
- The Anglophone Teachers Book Room
- The Anglophone Office

Please don't leave books in the classrooms as they can get lost!

Help - my book is overdue!

- You will receive an email telling you that your book is due to be returned.
- After this email you have 1 week to return the book to the library.
- If you don't, your parents will be contacted and asked to pay for the book to be replaced.

What happens if I lose a book?

Tell the librarian in charge about lost / damaged books. Your parents will be contacted by email and asked to pay for the book to be replaced.

University Guidance: UNIFROG

We will use **Unifrog** to help Terminale students prepare to apply to university.

Unifrog is a university guidance platform focusing on courses offered world wide in English. <u>https://www.unifrog.org/</u>

Each student has an individual and personal student account.

Parent accounts are also available: these are 'dummy' accounts which allow you to explore Unifrog as if you were a student.

<u>Video link here</u> explains how parents can sign up to Unifrog. The parent code to use is **LYOIParents50**.

NB. Pease don't create any genuine student accounts: the UG advisers actively use Unifrog to track student progress and 'fake' student accounts can make this difficult.



Finding an Internship (*stage en entreprise*)

UG Presentation: Think about your Stage 15th November 2023

- An important part of 3ème is finding an internship.
- Internships are a good way to explore careers you might be interested in.
- Internships are essential part of the application process to overseas universities.
- It shows you are a self-starter and that you have thought about what you want to do later in life
