3eme to 2nde Parent Night Summary:

The discussion focused on the transition from Troisième to Seconde, highlighting the curriculum similarities and the introduction of IGCSEs, which are crucial for students' academic advancement. Simon Herd explained that students will undertake two IGCSEs in English language and literature, recognized by universities, particularly in the UK. He reassured parents about the largely automatic transition process and emphasized the significance of coursework, which constitutes 40% of the final IGCSE mark. Additionally, he introduced a one-year drama course aimed at enhancing students' creative skills, detailing its schedule, associated costs, and the application process, which includes a written statement from students and prioritization for those with prior drama club experience.

Further, Simon addressed the transition process to Lycée, underscoring the importance of the Model United Nations club for developing skills relevant to university applications. He outlined the new curriculum for the Baccalauréat Français International, which emphasizes project-based learning and oral communication. Parents were encouraged to discuss academic specialties with their children, as these choices will influence future educational paths.

Tiff Foster raised concerns about communication regarding the meeting, which Simon acknowledged, promising to improve future notifications. Other questions from parents included the timing of the second stage and the availability of additional language options, which Simon clarified, ensuring parents were informed about the upcoming opportunities and resources available for their children.

Transition from Troisième to Seconde Overview

Simon Herd discussed the transition from Troisième to Seconde, highlighting the consistency in the curriculum and the introduction of the IGCSEs. He noted that students will take two IGCSEs in English language and literature, which are crucial for their future studies and university applications. The transition process is mostly automatic, reducing stress for students and parents.

* IGCSE Curriculum and Requirements

Simon Herd outlined the details of the drama option for second-year students, mentioning an exam fee of approximately 75 euros. He stressed the need for parental consent and informed decision-making, as enrollment comes with a financial commitment that cannot be

reversed after the first trimester. The application process will require students to submit a written statement of their motivations, with priority given to those who have participated in the drama club previously.

Overview of MUN and Academic Pathways for Students Transitioning to Secondes Simon Herd outlined the transition from Collège to Lycée, focusing on the Model United Nations (MUN) club as a key extracurricular activity that enhances students' debating skills and university applications. He also introduced the curriculum for the Baccalauréat Français International, which includes project-based learning and emphasizes the importance of oral communication skills. Herd encouraged parents to engage their children in discussions about future academic specialties.

Additionally, Shirin inquired about the music option's application process, which Simon described as straightforward and dependent on numbers.
