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International University Fair 2023

Inspiring students and broadening horizons

The recent University Fair was an overwhelming success! With more than 30 representatives from various institutions in attendance, it was a vibrant event that created a real buzz among our students.

Organised jointly by the Anglophone Section's University Guidance service and SRT Fairs, the event was the first of its kind to the held at the CSI for some years. Representatives from well-known institutions including Imperial College London (UK), University of Conneticut (US), Bishop's University (Canada), University of Groeningen (Netherlands) and EMLyon (France) joined a diverse range of smaller institutions to connect directly with students.

Through the day, *lycée* students explored their future options in subjects ranging from Business and Economics, to Science, Engineering and Hospitality. The atmosphere in the hall was energising - and very noisy! - as up to 100 students at a time made their way among the stalls: collecting brochures, tote bags and business cards. Most importantly students made the most of the opportunities to engage in direct conversation with the University representatives.

After lunch, the event was opened up to other schools in Lyon which offer either the baccalauréat français international (BFI) or other English-language courses of study. Around 150 visiting students and their teachers travelled to CSI from across the Lyon area to participate: this was also a great opportunity for some local networking.

Banned Books: literature & censorship across the world

The Anglophone Section Secondary Library is a great place for students to study and read. There's a wide range of books, ranging from contemporary fiction to classics, and from graphic novels to non-fiction plus new acquisitions focused on contemporary social issues such as feminism and migration. A team of 10 parent volunteers and 5 teachers run the library from day-to-day and make sure that the library is a welcoming and comfortable place.

We have just created our 'Banned Books' corner, in order to raise awareness about issues of freedom of speech and censorship. Book banning is the most widespread form of censorship in the United States, with children's literature being the primary target. In that part of the library, students can get information on the topic of book banning and are encouraged to read books that might be censored in certain areas of the world.
